## State of Kansas Bowling Education Liaison

**Purpose:** To promote and provide educational materials, resources, and opportunities to all schools in the state of Kansas, and to offer continuing education for adult bowlers.

### Essential Duties:

- a) The Liaison will meet with all KSBPA members to establish the level of commitment financially for the In-School Bowling Program and center availability for other programs.
- b) The Liaison will meet with the appropriate school official(s) in order to promote the In-School Bowling Program.
- c) The Liaison must be able to help solve any logistical issues the school or proprietor might have in the purchase, storing, transporting, or scheduled use of the In-School Bowling Program.
- d) The Liaison will provide an overview of the In-School Bowling Program to the school's PE teachers, including a mini workshop if requested.
- e) The Liaison must be well versed in high school bowling as a varsity sport, and have a prepared presentation suitable for a school board meeting.
- f) The Liaison must establish three pilot programs across the state.
- g) The Liaison will develop a best practices guide for youth bowling programs

### Other Duties:

- a) The Liaison must be or become a USBC Certified bowling coach.
- b) The Liaison must be trained to use the In-School Bowling Program.
- c) The Liaison must be able to assist proprietors in training their own youth coaches and developing youth programs.

- d) The Liaison must attend and provide a working booth at the annual KAHPERD convention.
- e) The Liaison must attend at least one KSBPA meeting per year.
- f) The Liaison must establish a reference base of current In-School Bowling Programs and current high school varsity programs.
- g) The Liaison must provide the proprietor with a means to measure the success of the In-School Bowling Program in his area.
- h) The Liaison must maintain a daily log of visits to centers and schools and the outcome of those meetings. Matrices will be established to evaluate progress and job performance; to whom and at what frequency the Liaison will report will be determined at time of hire.

A key component of this position is continuing education through instruction at the center level. As new bowlers are being developed on the youth level, it is imperative that current adult bowlers have an opportunity to develop their skills. Therefore, the Liaison will offer and give private and small group lessons, for a fee, at centers throughout the state.

This is a multi-phase project with long-term objectives. However, there will be situations where phases will run concurrently because of needs in different areas. The phases established at this time are the following:

Phase I: Establish the In-School Bowling program in schools across the state.

Phase II: Establish club level bowling in middle schools and varsity bowling in high schools.

Phase III: Provide continuing instruction for individuals, coaches, and proprietors in the state.

Phase III includes an opportunity for the Liaison to earn money above the salary through private, group, and clinic instructions at bowling centers.

This is a tentative outline of the phases, objectives, and duties. These elements are subject to modifications as the program objectives are met.

**Travel Requirements:** This position requires extensive travel within the state of Kansas, including some overnight stays.

The Liaison must be committed to and value bowling as a life-time sport or hobby and be able to share their enthusiasm. The Liaison must be knowledgeable about all aspects of bowling.

Consideration will be given to all proficiencies of an applicant not just bowling skill. The Liaison must be comfortable in academic settings as well as bowling centers. Problem solving and the ability to build upon successful programs will be essential to this position. An understanding of the education and recreation fields would be a plus. A college degree would be an asset but not necessary.
